## PASTORAL NOTE

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Third Sunday of Advent is traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday, so-called from the first word of the antiphon at the introit. Gaudete (“rejoice”), taken from Latin translation of Phil 4:4-5, sets a tone of joyful expectation for the Lord’s birth and Second Coming.

John the Baptist instructed the people on proper life in a community: share their clothing and food, and the soldiers should stop extorting funds and be satisfied with their wages. In the midst of the difficulties of living under Roman occupation. John tells them that someone is mightier than he is coming. He preaches this Good News of Christ, knowing that the arrival of Jesus was a cause for joy. The mighty Saviour was coming, and this Good News trumped any negative situation on faced.

Advent is a time to prepare ourselves for our Saviour. We may find ourselves in less-than-ideal circumstances right now due to health, employment, or other issues. Sometimes these deficiencies dominate our state of mind, and we forget all too easily what we do have—a Lord who is in our midst, today and every day. He is our joy; he is eternal and everlasting.

We light the rose candle this third Sunday of Advent to remind us to rejoice, even if we face challenges as Zephaniah and Paul did. We do not need to experience something extravagant to throw our hand in the air and praise God. The Lord is coming indeed, he is here, our mighty Saviour.

## OUR IMPACT



Served **109,109** of the most vulnerable people in our region thanks to the dedication of **4,070** staff members and **2,816** volunteers.



Twelve Regional Family Centers offered **43,260** people access to diverse programs, including outreach and walk-in services; transitional and permanent housing; medical, mental health, and substance use disorder treatment; and case management and volunteer services.



Our Long Term Care System provided **5,784** individuals with **2,045,392** hours of home care, including help with walking or mobility, bathing, foot care, transferring, chores, meal preparation, and nurse-delegated care.



Transportation, senior nutrition, and home care programs helped **22,312** individuals maintain their independence.



Catholic Housing Services provided **3,016** units of permanent affordable housing for individuals, families, veterans, seniors, and people with disabilities.



**40** shelters and repurposed motels offered **306,986** emergency bed nights for single adults and families experiencing homelessness.



Family Behavioral Health System provided **255,827** hours of in-home behavioral health services to **18,449** children, youth, and family members.



An additional **19,763** individuals accessed mental health services, and **3,280** individuals received addiction recovery counseling from regional CCS providers.
