Meditation by Archbishop Joseph Nang Nguyen

Meditation: Two disciples of Jesus were on their way to the village of Emmaus. This was probably an escape after Jesus was captured and killed. The road back to Emmaus is very far away, confused, sad, and disappointed! The two men tiredly trudge along... They did not expect Jesus to accompany them, talking and explaining the Scriptures to them. Jesus tried to change the dark thoughts in them along the way.

Prayer: "Lord Jesus, on the reverse of life, we cannot escape the wobbly times, the moments of tilt, confusion, and disappointment. Please help us to see You sharing your life with us, reaching out to free us through our brothers and sisters around us, through Your Church. Amen.

Remember: "They recognized him when he broke the bread".
